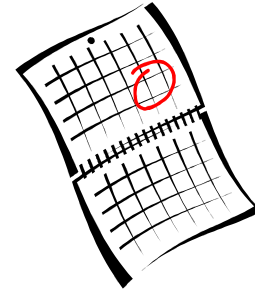

CLASSIFICATION (PUBLICATIONS, FILMS AND COMPUTER GAMES) ENFORCEMENT ACT 1995

Parents

Are you aware of the content of some films and games your child/ren may be viewing? Here is a précis of the censorship classifications:

G – GENERAL

The G classification is for a general audience. However, it does not necessarily indicate that children will enjoy the film or computer game. Some G films and games contain themes, story-lines or game play that does not interest children.

The impact of the classifiable elements (themes, violence, sex, language, drug use and nudity) should be very mild only.

PG – PARENTAL GUIDANCE

PG may contain material which some children find confusing or upsetting, and may require the guidance of parents or guardians. It is not recommended for viewing or playing by persons under 15 without guidance from parents or guardians.

The impact of the classifiable elements for material should be no higher than mild.

M – MATURE

Material classified M is not recommended for persons under 15 years of age. There are no legal restrictions on access.

The impact of the classifiable elements for M classifications should be no higher than moderate.

MA 15+ - MATURE ACCOMPANIED

Material classified MA 15+ is considered unsuitable for persons under 15 years of age. It is a legally restricted category.

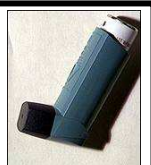
The impact of the classifiable elements for MA 15+ should be no higher than strong.

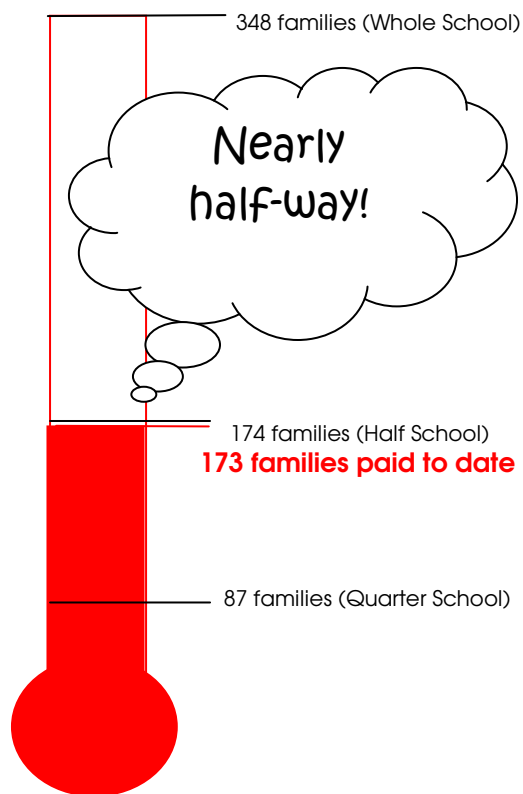
