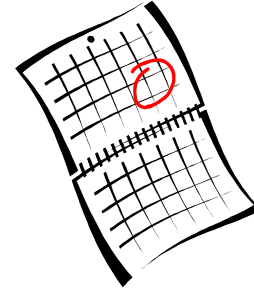

- Wholemeal or wholegrain toast or fresh bread, with margarine spread plus a topping, such as jam, tomato, reduced-fat cheese, peanut butter or baked beans
- breakfast cereal, low fat milk and fruit
- rice or noodles on their own or with lean meat or vegetables
- reduced-fat yoghurt, fruit, raisin bread.
- Serve breakfast with a glass of water or milk to get children hydrated.

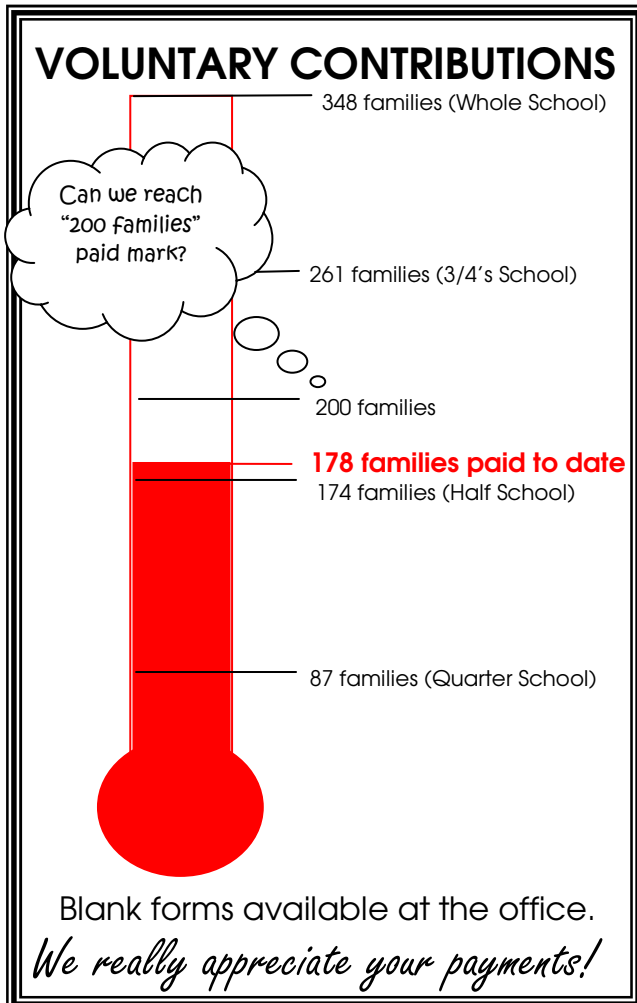

SWINE FLU

On 24th May 2009 the Director-General of Education and Training in NSW sent out advice to government schools that the Department of Education and Training (DET) is working with NSW Health to ensure that NSW schools are prepared to implement steps to minimise the impact and spread of human swine influenza.

To limit exposure and spread of the virus, schools are required to take to exclude staff and students for a period of seven days where they may have been in a country affected by human swine influenza. Currently where staff or students have returned or arrived from Mexico, USA, Canada, Japan or Panama they will be required to stay away from school for this period. This list of countries will be continually revised by the DET and NSW Health and may extend to travel from other countries.

If staff and students remain well and do not show any symptoms after seven days they may return to school as the symptoms to the virus are thought to develop between 24 hours – seven days after possible contact.
